NEW Conversational English For Independence (CEFI) course

In response to feedback we have received we are delighted to let you know that we are starting a pre-Employability Programme English Course – Conversational English For Independence (CEFI).



Conversational English For Independence (CEFI)

- Six weeks Twelve sessions
- 6 (90-minute) in person (or remote dial-in) sessions of interactive taught content related to topics in the Employability Programme.
- 6 online drop-in conversational practice sessions.



Referral Criteria

- Female Survivor of Modern Slavery
- Age 18+ (no upper age limit)
- Basic Level of English (we aren't able to accept participants with no English)
- Happy to participate in group and 121 sessions



Non-Essential

- NRM
- Conclusive Grounds Decision
- Right to Work
- Commitment to any other Sophie Hayes Foundation programmes (we hope CEFI is a helpful stepping-stone to CREW and/or the Employability Programme but there is no requirement to join either of these on completion)



Referral Process

After CEFI



Employability Programme - Participants can go on to join the next EP. They don't need to be referred again.



CREW - If participants aren't ready to join the EP, they can join CREW (survivor network) first and join the EP in the future. They don't need to be referred again.



Pause or Exit - Participants can pause CEFI, continue with CREW and re-join CEFI when they're ready (they don't need to be referred again). Participants can complete CEFI and then exit all other SHF services. Participants can be referred again if they would like to restart any of our programmes.
